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17 **MINUTES REVIEW AND APPROVAL**

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19 Minutes of the March 21, 2013 Trails Committee meeting were reviewed. Chair Matt
20 Johnson made a **motion** to approve the minutes as amended. Mikael Remington seconded the
21 motion, which was passed by unanimous vote (7-0).
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23 **REPORT ON LAST SATURDAY'S 10K HIKE/RUN**

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25 Denise Cox reported the 10K hike/run on April 13th on the Bonneville Shoreline Trail
26 went very well. The Davis Clipper printed an article about the hike/run on April 11th, and this
27 might be why there was great support for this event. Committee members also made personal
28 contacts advertising this event. There were 19 people who ran the 10K, and 23 people who did
29 the hike. Several people requested this type of event be held again along with the possibility of a
30 geocaching hike.
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32 **BIKE RIDE ON MAY 15th**

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34 The Trails Committee will sponsor a Bike Ride on Wednesday, May 15th at 7:00 p.m.
35 beginning at the Porter/Walton Park. This will be a 10 to 15-mile bike ride that will go south to
36 Pages Lane, and then west to the Legacy Parkway. Denise Cox will contact the Police
37 Department, and ask them to provide an officer to conduct a short safety demonstration and then
38 to lead the bike ride. Mike Anderson from the Boy Scout Round Table will be notified of this
39 event so that Boy Scout groups in the area can be notified. This bike ride will satisfy
40 requirements #6 & #7 for the Cycling Merit Badge. Mikael Remington will make flyers to
41 advertise this event.

REPORT ON FRONTAGE ROAD FEDERAL GRANT

Bruce Cox, Parks and Recreation Director, reported a \$900,000 Federal Alternative Transportation Grant that Centerville applied for was recommended by the Wasatch Front Regional Council Staff and passed the committee vote to go on to the next step of approval by the elected officials on the WFRC to widen the Frontage Road 8 to 10 feet on the west side from McDonald's Restaurant north to Lund Lane. This widening will allow for re-aligning of the lanes and 4-foot wide bike lanes to be striped on both sides of the Frontage road. The City must give a six (6) percent match to the grant at the time of construction. If awarded, the grant money is scheduled for 2019 but it is hoped work can begin in 2018, and perhaps sooner if all project preparation work can be completed and ready earlier.

REPORT/DISCUSS VOLUNTEER PROJECTS AND MAKE ASSIGNMENTS

Chair Johnson reported several people have called him about volunteer and Eagle Scout projects. The Committee discussed possible projects on George Haddad's property, making and installing kiosks on trails, clearing the Ford Canyon Trail and Legacy Trail area, and painting bike stencils on the bike lanes.

At 8:25 p.m., Julie Creer was excused from the meeting.

The Committee discussed doing a field trip to view and identify areas for possible service projects.

IDENTIFY FOR COUNTY TRAILS MAP; CENTERVILLE'S MAIN POINT OF INTEREST

Denise Cox attended the County Trails Map meeting recently, and it is hoped the County Trails Map will be completed this summer. The Committee needs to determine one point of interest for Centerville that will be on this map. After discussion, it was agreed the Freedom Hills Trail will be Centerville's main point of interest on the map.

The kiosk on the Parrish Lane Trailhead blew over in the recent east wind. Bruce Cox, Parks and Recreation Director, reported he retrieved the kiosk and it is in the yard behind the parks building.

The bridge at Rick's Creek in Ford Canyon that was destroyed by vandals last year has been rebuilt.

Rick Turner reported he will be meeting with George Haddad on Sunday to discuss service projects to repair erosion that has occurred on his property.

It was reported earlier in the year that the Rail Trail from Centerville to Kaysville would be paved this year. Engineering work and some preparation work has begun, but the project will not be completed until next year.

At 8:40 p.m., Rick Turner and Thomas Tasker were excused from the meeting.

The Trails Committee will have a booth at the 4th of July festivities.
