MINUTES REVIEW AND APPROVAL

Minutes of the March 25, 2014 meeting minutes were reviewed. Chair Alan Peterson made a **motion** to approve the minutes as amended. Matt Johnson seconded the motion, which was passed by unanimous vote (5-0).

FOLLOW UP TO VOLUNTEER PROJECTS MASTER LIST

Denise Cox reported she has started the Volunteer Projects Master List. She will forward the list to the Committee via email. Projects that need to be added to this list are to dig out some of the water bars at the Freedom Hills Trail and bury them lower. This would be a good service project. Water has also eroded the steps of the Rockwood Trail, and they need to be repaired. The Committee agreed a field trip should be taken to view other service projects that could be done. Mikael Remington said he will talk to Rick Turner about the steps that were constructed at Snowbasin??? Ski Resort that have prevented erosion there. The new football coach at Viewmont High School contacted Mr. Remington, and said the football team is looking for service projects the team can do in the community.

"RACE THE MAYOR" DETAILS AND ASSIGNMENTS

Matt Johnson described the route the 5K and 10K runners will take for the "Race the Mayor" fun run. The races will be held on April 26th, at 8:30 a.m. beginning at the Parrish Lane trail head. Bruce Cox, Parks and Recreation Director, said he will provide cones and stakes for trail markers. Denise Cox will provide timing equipment. Wasatch Running will have a tent at the trailhead and prizes. Skills Fitness will be providing gym passes.

Bruce Cox will also provide water for this event. Committee members will meet on April 25th at 6:00 p.m. to place the markers and signs. Dennis DeBoer will provide 200 race bibs at no charge. Chick-Fil-A said they would like to do a service project in the community, and Mr. Cox will ask them to help with this event. Denise Cox informed the Bountiful Junior High and Centerville Junior High Track Coaches, and there will be an advertisement in The Davis Clipper for this event.

OTHER BUSINESS

Mark Dimond reported Rick Turner has talked with local ATV Clubs to try and resolve the problems of ATV's going off the marked roads and causing erosion on the hillside. The suggestion was made to have the ATV clubs install signage stating that ATV's and motorcycles need to stay on the roads, to protect their continued access to the Centerville hillside. Denise Cox will write an article for the next City newsletter explaining the erosion problems motorized vehicles are causing, and the rules that need to be followed by motorized trail users. The Committee discussed having the president of one of the ATV clubs being invited to a Committee meeting to see if a cooperated effort could be made to get ATV users to stay on the roads.

Rick Turner joined by telephone and he reported he visited with George Haddad, Police Chief Worsley, and Steve Thacker, City Manager. It was agreed that signage needs to be placed on Mr. Haddad's property informing ATV riders where they cannot ride. The signs could be ready within two weeks. It is difficult for the Police Department to continually patrol Mr. Haddad's property. Service projects would be a great help on this property where erosion has occurred, and there are at least ten areas where service projects could take place.

NEXT MEETING

The next Trails Committee meeting will be held on Thursday, May 15th at 6:00 p.m., beginning with a field trip at the Rockwood Trailhead at the top of Chase Lane, and then to George Haddad's property.
