17 **MINUTES REVIEW AND APPROVAL**

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19 Minutes of the June 19, 2014 Trails Committee meeting minutes were reviewed. Matt
20 Johnson made a **motion** to approve the minutes as written. Rick Turner seconded the motion,
21 which was passed by unanimous vote (7-0).

23 **FOLLOW UP TO VOLUNTEER PROJECTS MASTER LIST**

24
25 Denise Cox reported she misplaced the Volunteer Projects Master List. Bruce Cox, Parks
26 and Recreation Department, reported he participated in helping Farmington City host a bike tour
27 yesterday for the Wasatch Front Regional Council Alternative Transportation Committee.
28 Farmington has 55 trail chiefs to monitor trails in Farmington. The trail Chiefs regularly walk
29 assigned trails, and make recommendations of projects that need to be done on the trails for
30 volunteer and Eagle Scout projects. Mr. Cox suggested recruiting volunteer trail chiefs in
31 Centerville to help monitor our trails. The Committee agreed Centerville would benefit by having
32 trail chiefs, and Denise Cox will make a job description list for the trail chiefs. Mr. Cox said he
33 will make recruiting signs to be posted at the trailheads to advertise the trail chief positions. Rick
34 Turner will ask Jacob Smith to advertise this position on the City website, and create a "Trails
35 Fan" website.

37 The D&RG Trail has not been updated on the trail map, and Mike Smith will be contacted
38 to update the map. Kenny Williams or Randy Randall will be contacted to see what roads are
39 scheduled for striping next, and then schedule bike lanes to be painted where possible. The
40 Committee discussed making a video of the major trails which could be on the City website for
41 people to view. This could possibly be done as an Eagle Scout project.

1 **REPORT ON JULY 1ST BIKE EVENT AND JULY 4TH BOOTH**

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3 There were three people who attended the bike event on July 1st. The Committee agreed
4 advertising for these events should be done sooner prior to the activity. The Committee agreed to
5 have only two major trail events starting in 2015 that will hopefully attract more participation.

6
7 There were 20 people who signed the form at the July 4th booth showing an interest in trail
8 activities. The Committee agreed the 4th of July booth was a success.

10 **UPDATE ON FIRE BREAK ROAD SIGNS, I-15 PEDESTRIAN**
11 **CROSSING/LEGACY CONNECTION**

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13 Bruce Cox, Parks and Recreation Director, distributed a draft of the proposed sign to be
14 placed on the Fire Break Road. The sign describes the rules for motorized vehicles, and the fine
15 for the illegal discharge of firearms in the area. The signs will be made of aluminum on a metal
16 post, and will be 18" x 24". The installation could be done as an Eagle Scout Project.

18 Mr. Cox reported the pedestrian bridge over I-15 will be constructed next spring. The
19 bridge will be ten feet wide and will cross over I-15 and the railroad tracks on the north side of the
20 interchange, and end on 1250 West. Plans are being made for a Maverick Gas Station to be built
21 on the south side of Parrish Lane at 1250 West near the Legacy Trail. The Trails Committee
22 discussed approaching Maverick about making this gas station "cyclist friendly", with grass, picnic
23 tables, and easy to access restrooms. Mark Dimond suggested asking Maverick to also have a
24 Dero Fixit Bike Repair Station at the new location, which is a mini self-repair bike station with
25 basic bike repair tools. A picture of the Dero Fixit was emailed to Committee members by Mr.
26 Dimond.

27
28 Mr. Cox said grant money will be awarded to the City to widen the Frontage Road by 10
29 feet for designated bike lanes on both East and West sides. This road expansion is scheduled for
30 2018, but sometimes the date can be scheduled moved up if the City has their preliminary work
31 completed.

33 **EVENTS FOR FALL/WINTER**

34
35 The fall hike will be on Monday, September 29th at the Parrish Lane Trail Head. Denise
36 Cox will advertise this event in The Davis Clipper, the City website, and through school emails.
37 The Committee discussed serving refreshments after the hike to hopefully attract more people.

39 **OTHER BUSINESS**

41 Rick Turner reported on the road where the Weber Basin repaired the erosion last spring.
42 Motor bikes are causing erosion, and perhaps an Eagle Scout project could help repair the area.

Denise Cox reported the Young Men and Young Women in her ward want a service project. The Committee suggested cleaning Mr. Haddad's property.

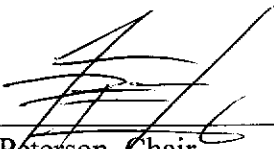
