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20 **MINUTES REVIEW AND APPROVAL**

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22 Minutes of the August 20, 2015 meeting minutes were reviewed. Co-Chair Mark Dimond
23 made a **motion** to approve the minutes as amended. Denise Cox seconded the motion, which was
24 passed by unanimous vote (4-0).

26 **FOLLOW UP ON VOLUNTEER PROJECTS**

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28 Matt Johnson reported an Eagle Scout recently completed his project on the Freedom Hills
29 Trail. He lowered the water-bars on the trail to help contain erosion. Another project on the trail
30 could be to clean the inside drainage areas before winter comes. The parking lot at the Parrish
31 Trailhead is in need of repair.

33 Matt Johnson reported that he, Lee Skabelund, and Bryce Trump with the Viewmont
34 Alumni Association walked the trail to the "V" on the mountain. The trail is very rocky, and is
35 sloped at 38 degrees. The Viewmont Alumni Association would like to make the trail family
36 friendly and easy to access. Mr. Skabelund recommended an 18 inch wide trail. Mr. Trump is
37 hoping a volunteer group can work on the trail as part of a service project for Homecoming.

39 **DISCUSS UDOT GRANT FOR POSSIBLE MAIN STREET BIKE LANES**

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41 Bruce Cox, Parks and Recreation Director, reported UDOT has grants available for cities
42 who want to improve transportation routes to schools for children. Councilwoman Tami Fillmore
43 suggested this grant, and she feels most of Main Street would qualify with Centerville Junior,
44 Reading Elementary, Centerville Elementary, and Stewart Elementary all on or close to Main
45 Street.

This grant would allow bike lanes to be painted on Main Street, or Share the Road signs to be placed where the road is too narrow. Mr. Cox will find out what is needed to apply for this grant. The Trails Master Plan shows bike lanes on Main Street from Pages Lane to Lund Lane.

OTHER BUSINESS

Bruce Cox reported on the grant to widen and put bike lanes on the Frontage Road. The grant funds will be available in 2018. The culverts that run under the Frontage Road need to be extended first, which is a costly project. There is no funding budgeted to do this project this year.

Mikael Remington is working with the Bonneville Shoreline Trail Race Committee to allow the Trails Committee to combine their 5k with the Bonneville Shoreline Trail Race next spring.

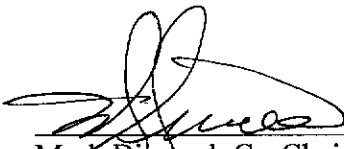
