26 **REPORT ON YOUTH COUNCIL INVOLVEMENT WITH TRAILS**

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28 Bruce Cox, Parks and Recreation Director, reported on the feedback from Youth Council
29 members who previously served with the Trails Committee. Some of the Youth Council felt they
30 were over worked, and other members felt they did not have enough to do on the various
31 committees. There are new applications being taken at this time for the Youth Council.

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33 **MOUNTAIN TRAIL RUN ASSIGNMENTS REVIEW AND DISCUSSION**

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35 The 5k and 10k Trail Run will be held April 23rd at 8:00 a.m. at the Parrish Lane trailhead.
36 Jacob Smith will send a tweet tomorrow reminding people of the race. Bruce Cox, Parks and
37 Recreation Director, has arranged for a portable toilet, water, and a tent that Mikael Remington
38 will bring to the race site Saturday morning. Mr. Cox will be attending an earthquake drill that
39 morning, and will be unable to attend the race. The gun range will be closed until the race is over.
40 Denise Cox will make arrangements to bring the timer to the race, and Matt Johnson will provide
41 course maps. Chair Dimond will provide donuts and chocolate milk.

TOP FIVE PRIORITY LIST

Committee members need to be considering the top five priorities they would like to see accomplished. One of the items is the widening of the Frontage Road from Parrish Lane north. The Master Plan was changed to have bike lanes on the road rather than a separate path. The west parking lot at the Community Park will be enlarged to have 100 additional parking stalls. There will be two new sports fields on the south end. The rough grading is completed and the drainage system has been installed. The next phase will include irrigation system, finish grading, grass and parking lot.

At 8:45 p.m., Matt Johnson arrived at the meeting.

There will also be a small playground, and a perimeter walking path as part of the expansion. The completion of this new addition depends on funding from Park Impact Fees and RAP Tax revenue. It is hoped these new additions can be completed sometime next year.

The Committee also discussed the possibility of widening the Frontage Road from Parrish Lane to Pages Lane, and adding bike lanes. They would also like to have a bike repair station at the Porter/Walton Park.

Minutes of the March 17, 2016 meeting minutes were reviewed. Mikael Remington made a **motion** to approve the minutes as written. Matt Johnson seconded the motion, which was passed by unanimous vote (4-0).

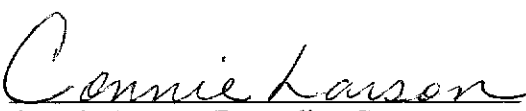
The next Trails Committee meeting will be held on Thursday, May 19, 2016 at 8:00 p.m. in the Business Conference Room at City Hall.
