Minutes of the Centerville City Trails Committee meeting held Thursday, November 17, 2016 at 8:00 p.m. in the City Hall Administrative Conference Room, 250 North Main Street, Centerville, Utah.

MINUTES REVIEW AND APPROVAL

Minutes of the October 27, 2016 meeting minutes were reviewed. Chair Dimond made a motion to approve the minutes as amended. Matt Johnson seconded the motion, which was passed by unanimous vote (4-0).

IDENTIFY COMMITTEE SPONSORED EVENTS FOR 2017

Chair Dimond reported Denise Cox contacted the principal at Jennie P. Stewart Elementary School who said she will ask the teachers if they are interested in having their students take a guided hike in the mountains. Over the past few years, the hikes and the bike rides have not been well attended, but the Trail Run has done better. Matt Johnson suggested a service day to improve or clean a trail in the city. The Trails Committee agreed they will do the Fourth Annual Trail Run on June 3, 2017. Mark Oligschlaeger said he would prefer making the current activities better, and not add new activities. He suggested better trail markings for the Trail Run. The Trails Committee agreed they will not plan more activities, but instead focus on trail development and volunteer projects.

UPDATE ON SIGNAGE AND SAFETY IDEAS FOR PEDESTRIAN BRIDGE

Mark Oligschlaeger reported he talked with Scott Hess from the Wasatch Front Regional Council, and Tom Miller from the Alta Planning Firm. The Alta Planning Firm solicits candidates for active transportation plans, and Committee members received a link on this firm.

1 Grants can be applied for through the Wasatch Front Regional Council for bike lanes. They study
2 traffic counts and patterns, and they talk with constituents and focus groups and hold work
3 sessions. Kaysville and Farmington worked together on their trail system, and Alta Planning
4 suggested Centerville and Bountiful have a connecting bike trail system. Grant money can be
5 applied for to do an active transportation plan. The cost of the transportation plan is \$70,000, and
6 applications for the grant is due in October. Mr. Oligschlaeger said grant money could be used to
7 research an active transportation plan for Centerville.

9 Bruce Cox, Parks and Recreation Director, said a \$900,000 grant is coming through this
10 same organization to widen the Frontage Road and to paint bike lanes. This grant was given
11 because it fit with the County's plan to connect the north end and south end of the County together.
12 Mr. Oligschlaeger suggested representatives from Alta Planning be invited to a future Trails
13 Committee meeting to talk about a transportation plan for Centerville, and signage that would help
14 bike transportation. These ideas could then be taken to the Planning Commission and City Council
15 for their consideration.

17 The Trails Committee viewed a map of the bike lanes in Centerville that Mr. Oligschlaeger
18 also discussed with Alta Planning. They gave Mr. Oligschlaeger suggestions on how a grant could
19 be used for better bike signage and lights at the pedestrian overpass at the northbound freeway
20 entrance, and improvement of bike lanes and trails in Centerville. Mr. Oligschlaeger said Police
21 Chief Paul Child was also in the meeting, and he suggested removing the sidewalks on Parrish
22 Lane and having dedicated bike and pedestrian lanes instead of sidewalks.

24 Mark Oligschlaeger will invite the Alta Planning Firm to the January 19, 2017 Trails
25 Committee meeting.

27 **HILLSIDE TRAIL MASTER PLAN WORKING SESSION**

29 The Trails Committee viewed an aerial photograph of the trails above Centerville. The
30 Committee discussed having two larger trail loops for mountain bikes that would connect to the
31 Bonneville Shoreline Trail. Bike trails could be marked with survey tape that would differentiate
32 biking trails and hiking trails. Bruce Cox, Parks and Recreation Director, said the bike trail drops
33 down Island View Drive and comes near the Island View Park. The Parks and Recreation
34 Committee is discussing having a switchback trail in this park when the park is renovated. There
35 is a home with a utility easement that could be a possible trail connection to Island View Park.

37 Brandon Federico said there are people who would like to start November 26th marking the
38 trails, and possibly begin clearing the ground, depending on the weather. A pump track could
39 possibly be made north of the Deuel Creek reservoir above and below the firebreak road. The
40 Committee discussed the possibility of working with Bountiful and Farmington on connecting bike
41 trails.

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UPDATE ON ANY RECENT/FUTURE VOLUNTEER PROJECTS

Bruce Cox, Parks and Recreation Director, reported that Jamison Yardley restained six trail kiosks and replace the maps for his Eagle Scout Project.
