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18 **DETERMINATION LETTER**

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20 George McEwan, City Council Liaison, read the Determination Letter in accordance with
21 Utah Code 52-4-207(4) of the Utah Open and Public Meeting Act that states according to the

24 **INTRODUCTION OF NEW MEMBERS**

26 New members of the Trails Committee were introduced. They are: Eric Johnson, Jamison
27 Pexton, Del Ruesch, and Sherrae Phelps.

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29 **ELECTION OF CHAIR AND VICE CHAIR**

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31 Matt Johnson made a **motion** to elect Mikael Remington as chair of the Trails Committee.
32 Sherrae Phelps seconded the motion, which was passed by unanimous vote (6-0).

34 Matt Johnson made a **motion** to elect Sherrae Phelps as vice chair of the Trails Committee.
35 Eric Johnson seconded the motion, which was passed by unanimous vote (6-0).

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37 **TRAILS MAINTENANCE**

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39 Chair Mikael Remington reported he met with Mayor Wilkinson, and he would like the
40 Trails Committee to brainstorm on what changes and improvements can be made on the hillside
41 to make a difference for the community and hillside. Sherrae Phelps said she is a trail runner, and
42 would like to see unofficial trails become official trails. She would like to see trail signs placed at
43 the trailheads. Sherrae talked with Mayor Wilkinson on the section of the Bonneville Shoreline
44 Trail that goes above the zigzag trail. It was filled with dog waste, and she and her family cleaned
45 it up. She would like to see better maintenance of the trails.

1 Jamison Pexton said Centerville had momentum several years ago to improve the trails,
2 but the trail system has not progressed as fast as Fruit Heights and Farmington. Del Ruesch asked
3 what authorization the Trails Committee would need to have from the Forest Service to make trails
4 on Forest Service Land. George McEwan, City Council Liaison, explained the City Council wants
5 a master plan for the 160 acres of hillside property on how it will be used for the various activities
6 to coexist. There have been problems with ATV users, hikers, and horses on the trails. The Trails
7 Committee needs to take the lead with a plan, and then the City Council can incorporate as many
8 ideas as possible.

10 Mikael Remington explained trail signage and maintenance was done several years ago by
11 a Boy Scout on the Deuel Creek Trail, along with Plexiglas signs and bridge repairs. Most of the
12 trail repairs and maintenance were done by Boy Scouts for Eagle Scout projects. It is not known
13 if Eagle Scout projects will take place. Approval to improve and expand trails must be
14 obtained from the property owners and the Forest Service.

16 Mikael Remington explained an Active Transportation Plan has been made of proposed
17 trails and bike lanes connecting with Bountiful City to make the two cities more connectable for
18 walking and biking. A grant has been approved to also make trail and bike lane connections with
19 North Salt Lake and Farmington. Bruce Cox, Parks and Recreation Director, will send the
20 completed Master Plan to Committee members. Mr. Remington also said a few years ago, plans
21 were made for a mountain bike trail on the Bonneville Shoreline area. Improvements were made,
22 but the Forest Service must give approval for new trails. In the past, the Trails Committee has
23 hosted running races on the trails, and a guided mountain bike tour.

25 Bruce Cox, Parks and Recreation Director, reported the Rotary Club will be doing a service
26 project on March 27th. The yellow rope across the east perimeter of the dike area will be replaced
27 that is used to keep ATV's outside of the area.
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29 **BIKE REPAIR STATION**

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31 Chair Mikael Remington reported a law firm would like to donate a bike repair station on
32 the hillside, which would be a donation of \$2,000. The Trails Committee discussed various
33 locations on the Bonneville Shoreline Trail where a bike repair station could be placed, and also
34 on the Freedom Hills Trail. Del Ruesch said he will walk the Legacy Trail at Parrish Lane to see
35 if there is a direction sign to the Maverick Gas Station where there are restrooms and a tire repair
36 station.
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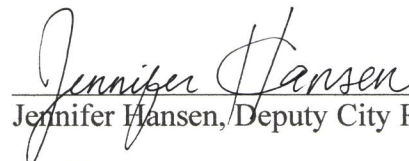
38 **NEXT MEETING**

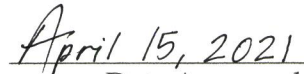
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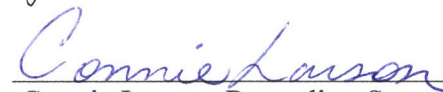
40 The next Trails Committee meeting will be held on Thursday, April 15, 2021 at 6:30 p.m.
