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26 **MINUTES REVIEW AND ACCEPTANCE**

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28 Minutes of the August 19, 2021 meeting were reviewed. Chair Mikael Remington
29 made a **motion** to approve the minutes as written. Matt Johnson seconded the motion, which was
30 passed by unanimous vote (6-0).

32 **STATUS ON SUNSET TRAIL PROJECT**

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34 The Trails Committee and volunteers have been working on the Sunset Trail, and a picture
35 of Matt Johnson and other volunteers working on the trail were on the cover of the Davis Journal
36 newspaper. Al Phelps and Mitzi Gray reported the railroad ties that were placed on the trail
37 prevented erosion from the recent rain storms. The Committee discussed having a bench placed
38 on the Sunset Trail where the trails split. Benches are good to help stop congestion on the trail,
39 and to keep motorcycles off the trails. Bruce Cox, Parks and Recreation Director, is in the process
40 of making the wood signs for the trails, but they are backordered 19 weeks. Parrish Creek was
41 rutted during the last two rainstorms. There are 100 yards of the trail beginning at the Parrish Creek
42 Trailhead that need four to five beams placed to stop erosion. It is easier to work on the trails when
43 they are moist, and it helps the grass seeds on the trails to germinate.

45 On October 25th, more maintenance will be done on the Sunset Trail. This project will be
46 advertised on the Centerville Trails Facebook page.

REVIEW NEXT PROJECT/TRAIL MAINTENANCE

The next trail maintenance project will be on Thursday, November 4th, on the North Deuel Creek Trail, as it has serious erosion problems. This project will be advertised on the Centerville Trails Facebook page. The South Deuel Creek Trail is being maintained by an elderly man who, along with his friends, repaired the bridge over the creek.

At the next meeting, Committee members are to bring a list of items they feel need to be completed on the trails, and when they should be completed. Pictures should also be taken of the projects that need to be done. There are currently 570 Facebook followers on the Centerville Trails Facebook page.

Eric Johnson reported he and a volunteer helped clear a trail for 16 hours on the upper section of the Parrish Creek Trail. Leland Barker and John Grogan are in charge of the 100 Mile Bear Wasatch Trail Race, and it is required for participants of the race to do volunteer service. In February 2022, Mr. Johnson will contact the race directors to request volunteers to help with trail maintenance projects in the spring.

DOG WASTE STATION INSTALL

Sherrae Phelps reported the dog waste stations have not been installed at this time. They will be placed at the Parrish Lane Trailhead and the Shoreline Trail.

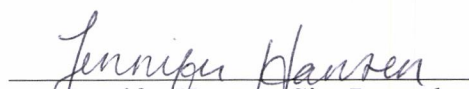
NEXT MEETING

The next Trails Committee meeting will be a Trails Maintenance Day scheduled for Thursday, November 18th.

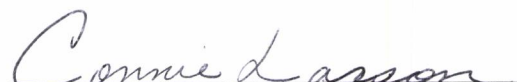
Mayor Wilkinson thanked the Trails Committee for their work and service. He said the City Council is behind the Trails Committee and they appreciate the work the Committee is doing.
