APPOINT COMMITTEE CHAIR AND CO-CHAIR FOR 2022

Matt Johnson made a **motion** to appoint Michael Remington as Chair of the Centerville Trails Committee. Mitzi Gray seconded the motion, which was passed by unanimous roll-call vote (4-0).

Chair Michael Remington made a **motion** to appoint Sherrae Phelps as Co-Chair of the Centerville Trails Committee. Jamison Pexton seconded the motion, which was passed by unanimous vote (4-0).

SIGN DELIVERY UPDATE

Trail signs are scheduled to arrive in February. The Committee discussed placing benches on the trails.

2022 ANNUAL MEETING SCHEDULE

There are conflicts with some of the Committee members with the proposed meeting schedule for 2022. The schedule was not approved.

OVERLAY MAP FOR EXISTING OFF-SHOOT TRAILS

1
2 Spencer Summerhays, City Council Liaison, explained the City Council suggested the
3 overlay map to see what is on the hillside, and to see if new trails need to be made. From a
4 community standpoint, we are looking at a multi-use trail system that will show the community
5 all of the trails from north to south. More of the hillside is being naturalized, and there is a plan
6 from a re-naturalized standpoint to keep people on the trails long term.

7
8 Mitzi Gray said the Sunset Trail is a good example of a trail that is being reconstructed by
9 hand. Bryce King, Recreation Coordinator, suggested having three trail building events each year,
10 and ask the City Council to allocate money for tools to help with the project. Mitzi Gray and Al
11 Ruesch will determine what the costs will be to do three projects on the trails in Centerville this
12 year. Donations and contributions will also be solicited from the community. Mitzi Gary said that
13 REI wants Centerville to apply for the grant they have to help with trails in communities.

15 Mitzi Gray reported she has talked with some of the landowners on the foothills, and there
16 is a possibility that one of the landowners is interested in donating property for a trail access. She
17 suggested having conversations with property owners on donating property for land easements.
18 Lisa Romney, City Attorney, must be informed of any donation of property easements and plans
19 to acquire property for the city.

21 Bryce King explained the Trails Master Plan must be created, which will provide a
22 framework to work with in the General Plan. The General Plan will dictate trail preservation. It is
23 hoped the General Plan will be revised this year. The Trails Committee will continue to work on
24 the Trails Master Plan, and then it will be presented to the City Council to be implemented into
25 the General Plan. Mikael Remington will contact Trail Committee members next week on the
26 budget for the Trails Committee. Information on the trails will be given to Bryce King to put on
27 the city website.

28 29 **NEXT PROJECTS TO START/FINISH**

31 The clean-up on the Sunset Trail went very well, and it is now more walkable. The trails
32 that need maintenance are the Sunset Peak Trail, Parrish Creek Trail, Deuel Creek Trail, and the
33 Bonneville Shoreline Trail. Improvements on the trails below the "V" also need to be completed.
34 Members of the mountain bike teams are required to perform three hours of community trail
35 service, and they will be asked to do maintenance on these trails. Deuel Creek North Trail will be
36 the next trail scheduled for maintenance.
