28 Matt Johnson made a **motion** to appoint Michael Remington as Chair of the Centerville
29 Trails Committee. Mitzi Gray seconded the motion, which was passed by unanimous roll-call vote
30 (4-0).

32 Chair Michael Remington made a **motion** to appoint Sherrae Phelps as Co-Chair of the
33 Centerville Trails Committee. Jamison Pexton seconded the motion, which was passed by
34 unanimous vote (4-0).

44 schedule for 2022. The schedule was not approved.

OVERLAY MAP FOR EXISTING OFF-SHOOT TRAILS

Spencer Summerhays, City Council Liaison, explained the City Council suggested the overlay map to see what is on the hillside, and to see if new trails need to be made. From a community standpoint, we are looking at a multi-use trail system that will show the community all of the trails from north to south. More of the hillside is being naturalized, and there is a plan from a re-naturalized standpoint to keep people on the trails long term.

Mitzi Gray said the Sunset Trail is a good example of a trail that is being reconstructed by hand. Bryce King, Recreation Coordinator, suggested having three trail building events each year, and ask the City Council to allocate money for tools to help with the project. Mitzi Gray and Al Ruesch will determine what the costs will be to do three projects on the trails in Centerville this year. Donations and contributions will also be solicited from the community. Mitzi Gary said that REI wants Centerville to apply for the grant they have to help with trails in communities.

Mitzi Gray reported she has talked with some of the landowners on the foothills, and there is a possibility that one of the landowners is interested in donating property for a trail access. She suggested having conversations with property owners on donating property for land easements. Lisa Romney, City Attorney, must be informed of any donation of property easements and plans to acquire property for the city.

Bryce King explained the Trails Master Plan must be created, which will provide a framework to work with in the General Plan. The General Plan will dictate trail preservation. It is hoped the General Plan will be revised this year. The Trails Committee will continue to work on the Trails Master Plan, and then it will be presented to the City Council to be implemented into the General Plan. Mikael Remington will contact Trail Committee members next week on the budget for the Trails Committee. Information on the trails will be given to Bryce King to put on the city website.

NEXT PROJECTS TO START/FINISH

The clean-up on the Sunset Trail went very well, and it is now more walkable. The trails that need maintenance are the Sunset Peak Trail, Parrish Creek Trail, Deuel Creek Trail, and the Bonneville Shoreline Trail. Improvements on the trails below the "V" also need to be completed. Members of the mountain bike teams are required to perform three hours of community trail service, and they will be asked to do maintenance on these trails. Deuel Creek North Trail will be the next trail scheduled for maintenance.
