UDOT I-15 EIS PRESENTATION

Tiffany Pocock with UDOT provided an update on the timeline for the planned I-15/Parrish Lane Interchange project. Doug Graham with Horrocks Engineers updated the Council on design plans for the project, and answered questions from the Council. The Council discussed two design options (SPUI and diamond) for the Parrish Lane Interchange with the UDOT representatives. Alexis Verson with Horrocks Engineers described planned active transportation connections. City Manager Brant Hanson commented that an extension of 1250 West to connect to Farmington would be beneficial. City Engineer Kevin Campbell said he agreed a west frontage road would greatly improve regional connectivity.

Community Development Director Cory Snyder referred to existing and planned trail projects around 1250 West and Parrish Lane, and expressed concern about pedestrian access on the south side of the Interchange. Councilmember Summerhays said he believed it would be important to provide pedestrian bridge access to the east side of Frontage Road. Ms. Pocock said her team would be happy to work with staff to improve usability. Councilmember Hirst said she believed both planned pedestrian bridges would be heavily used.

Mayor Wilkinson thanked the UDOT representatives for their time.

DISCUSSION – SOCIAL MEDIA POLICY

City Attorney Lisa Romney continued a review of the drafted Social Media Policy with the Council, and requested feedback. Councilmember Summerhays said he liked the idea of City-assigned elected official social media accounts. A majority of the Council appeared to agree with the Social Media Policy next being presented in regular Council meeting.

ADJOURNMENT

At 6:58 p.m., Councilmember Summerhays **moved** to adjourn the work session. Councilmember Ince seconded the motion, which passed by unanimous vote (4-0).
