Mayor Wilkinson called the work session to order at 6:17 p.m.

**JOINT DISCUSSION WITH PLANNING COMMISSION**

Community Development Director Cory Snyder said the Planning Commission had discussed potential goals and put together a prioritized list earlier in the year, with a General Plan update as a top priority. Mr. Snyder described the rebranding study currently underway. He shared that the Trails Committee seemed interested in putting together a strategic plan for trail projects. Councilmembers and Commissioners discussed the importance of having a relevant General Plan.

Mayor Wilkinson said he considered a plan for the west side of the City to be a big priority. Councilmember Mecham said she agreed. Mr. Snyder commented that a market study for the west side had been initiated.

Chair Shegrud said she believed an update to the Transportation/Circulation Element of the General Plan was important. Councilmember Summerhays expressed agreement. Councilmember McEwan spoke in favor of having a FrontRunner stop in Centerville. He suggested focusing on the west-side portion of the General Plan update first, if possible.

Mr. Snyder said he would be retiring at the end of 2023, and spoke of moving forward with plans through the remainder of 2023 in a way that would avoid overwhelming a new Community Development Director. The group discussed possible future directions and decisions of the State

Legislature, as well as the importance of public feedback at City meetings. Mr. Snyder commented that a Water Element of the General Plan would be due in 2025. Chair Shegrud suggested researching additional ways to notify the community of public hearing issues.

**ADJOURNMENT**

At 6:57 p.m., Councilmember Summerhays **moved** to adjourn the work session. Councilmember Mecham seconded the motion.
