PLANNING/ASSIGNMENTS OF NEIGHBORHOOD NIGHTS IN CONJUNCTION WITH PARKS & RECREATION MONTH – JULY

Bryce King, Community Service Manager, explained the month of July is National Parks and Recreation month. The theme is, “Where Communities Grow,” and events will be held at the following parks:

PLANNING/ASSIGNMENTS OF GAME NIGHTS FOR JUNE/JULY AT CITY HALL

Open Play Game Nights will be held during June and July on Monday evenings at City Hall from 6:30 p.m. to 8:30 p.m. Citizens of all ages are welcome to come and play boardgames. Banners advertising this event were placed at the Community Park today.

FUNDRAISING DISCUSSION FOR COMMUNITY PARK PICKLEBALL COURTS

The Committee discussed fundraising for the pickleball courts at Community Park. Bryce King, Community Service Manager, suggested a giant pickleball paddle be used to engrave the names of donors, which is easier to maintain than bricks or pavers. Donations would be accepted in denominations of \$100, \$200, \$250, etc. Fundraising efforts will be discussed when Bruce Cox, Parks and Recreation Director, receives the design plans for the courts and batting cage. Matt Layton suggested using in-trade donation time from contractors in Centerville.

At 7:20 p.m., Gina Hirst was excused from the meeting.

Donations for the pickleball courts could be promoted at the July 4th parade. This will be discussed at the next meeting.

DISCUSSION – PARKS IMPROVEMENT IDEAS

The Committee discussed adult fitness equipment at the parks in Centerville. Bryce King, Community Service Manager, said he has sent out for bids, but has not received any at this time. Mr. King suggested Ninja Cross Fit equipment that he has seen at a park in Layton. Adam Alba suggested if a park is scheduled for an upgrade, that adult exercise equipment could be considered at that time. The exercise equipment costs \$3,000 to \$7,000, and grants can be applied for to help with funding.
