MINUTES REVIEW AND APPROVAL

Minutes of the May 23, 2023 meeting were reviewed. Bob Brown made a **motion** to approve the minutes as written. Jana Taylor seconded the motion, which was passed by unanimous vote (4-0).

DIRECTOR REPORT

Lisa Sommer reported the gardens are growing very well, and people are taking good care of their plots. There are 40 plots, and all of them were sold this year. The Museum did not have a garden this year, because the hardscape around the Museum is being planned for a patio behind the Museum.

CLG/RAP UPDATES ON JOBS

Lisa Sommer reported that because of the late winter, the contractors have been working on other jobs which have pushed the museum RAP jobs past June of FY23. Nate Plaizier, City Accountant, told Lisa that unused RAP money from FY23 can be forwarded to 20 FY24, so that no money will be lost. The kitchen sink will be completed by June 30. The once-a-year deep cleaning of the Museum will take place next week.

The current CLG cycle projects are on track to be completed by the August 30 cutoff date:

- Repair and restoration of the front door of the shed per the Fire Marshall's request to meet fire codes.
- Down spouts to be extended.
- Cedar shaker shingles preservation with oil.
- Replacement of damaged shaker shingles.
- Paint around windows and doors.

- Seal stone and mortar on exterior walls.
- Caulk and seal windows.

VICTORIAN TEA PARTY

Lisa Sommer reported there were 96 people who attended the Tea Party. There were 47 tickets sold at a cost of \$30 per ticket, and 49 tickets were given away to people who have provided service to the Museum. The total cost of the caterer was \$2,305. Guests were pleased with the menu. Lisa reported it was difficult to find servers for this event, due to vacations, etc. Those who volunteered did a wonderful job and were much appreciated. A few members of the Centerville Youth Council helped with the Tea and did a professional, efficient job. A request will be made for more YC members to help with next year's event. The Paula Morgan, Jim Morgan's (WMB Chair) wife, attended the Tea Party, and she said it was fun and calming and plans to attend next year with more friends. Effective advertising of this event must be done if it is held in the future.

STORYTELLING – BEAR RIVER MASSACRE

Lisa Sommers reported Darren Parry, a Shoshone Indian leader, author of 'The Bear River Massacre,' and lecturer; did the June Storytelling Event on the Bear River Massacre that occurred on January 29, 1863. The United States Government massacred over 400 Shoshone Indians near Preston, Idaho. One of the women who survived the massacre lived to be 104 years old. The land where the massacre occurred has been given back to the Shoshone Nation and is being restored to its previous habitat. Kiosks tell the story as funds are being raised to build an interactive center.

JULY 4th ACTIVITIES

Lisa Sommer, Connie Larson and Whitaker board members, will be selling root beer floats in front of the Museum on July 4th from 8:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. The floats will be sold for 25 cents each, and the money will be used to purchase summer plants for the garden. Judy Gunn will be on the porch spinning silk with her spinning wheel.

FLASHBACK FOR JULY

The Flashback activity will be the Heritage Fair on July 13th, beginning at 5:00 p.m. Lisa Sommer distributed a flyer showing the locations of the events on the Museum grounds. There will be pioneer period games, spinning wheel demonstrations, horseshoeing demonstration, mountain man lecture, Mormon Battalion demonstrations, Potato and Corn Food Booth and other activities including, Clive Romney's performance that night.
