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20 **MINUTES REVIEW AND APPROVAL**

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22 Minutes of the May 9, 2023 meeting were reviewed. Tiffany Rees made a **motion** to  
23 approve the minutes as written. Hailey Turner seconded the motion, which was approved by  
24 unanimous vote (4-0).

26 **PICKLEBALL COURTS AND BATTING CAGES FUNDRAISING**

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28 Bryce King, Community Service Manager, displayed the fundraising flyer he made to raise  
29 money for the pickleball courts and batting cages at the Community Park. The fundraising  
30 donations will be as follows:

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32 Bronze - \$100 Platinum - \$ 1,000  
33 Silver - \$250 Diamond - \$ 2,500  
34 Gold - \$500 Legacy - \$5,000

36 The Legacy donors will have their names engraved on the granite sign at the Community  
37 Park. The Diamond donors will have their names engraved on the park bench, and other donors  
38 will have their names on a banner sign that will be displayed at the park April – October. The  
39 banner sign will be a windscreen mesh sign.

41 **At 7:30 p.m., Gina Hirst, City Council Liaison, arrived at the meeting.**

43 The Parks and Recreation Committee discussed allowing businesses and private donors to  
44 split the cost of donations. Shared ownership will be limited to two businesses or individuals on  
45 the Legacy donation. The fundraising for the courts will be advertised at the 4<sup>th</sup> of July festivities,

and at the Movies in the Park. Bryce King is working on having donations received electronically, rather than at City Hall.

The Committee viewed the architects drawing of the proposed pickleball courts. The proposed drawing shows trees surrounding the courts, which the Committee does not want, as it will take too much time to clear the leaves off the courts. The trees need to be planted away from the courts, or have another type of shading feature to shade the courts.

Assignments were previously made for the Movies in the Park, and the first movie will be on June 16<sup>th</sup>.

The next Parks and Recreation Committee meeting will be held on Tuesday, September 12, 2023 at 7:00 p.m. at City Hall.

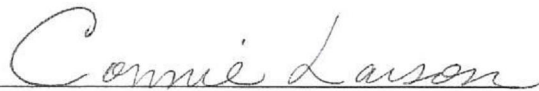
**ADJOURN**
