Option 1: Fun Sports Option. Swing, Zipline, and Spinners.

Option 2: Ninja Course Option. Most of these items are on our Sale Flyer, so you would have some wiggle room in your budget for site prep or changing things around.

Option 3: Sports Option with Net Climber, Zipline, and a spinner.

Rubber prices do not include the required compacted stone base prep, let me know if you need us to do that, or if you guys are okay to handle that. I've also attached our color charts for the rubber and the playground equipment.

Let me know if you like certain items or not. In my experience, the Zipline, Swings, and Spinners are the most popular pieces at a playground and are requested the most, but the zipline does require a little more maintenance than a climber, so it just depends on your preference. My kids only question when we go to a park is "does it have a zipline?". Which is why I put it in 2 of the designs. Let me know if you like the sports theming. Also, let me know which items you'd like to keep, or if one of the options encompasses exactly what you're looking for. I'm happy to redesign until we get the perfect design for you :)

MINUTES REVIEW AND APPROVAL

Minutes of the October 10, 2023 meeting were reviewed. Sean Hall made a **motion** to approve the minutes as written. Adam Alba seconded the motion, which was passed by unanimous vote (4-0).

INTRODUCTION OF NEW MEMBERS

Brooke Lewis and Aaron Getz are new members of the Parks and Recreation Committee. Mr. Getz has lived in Centerville for seven years, and he works for Autodesk, a software company.

PICKLEBALL COURTS AND PLAYGROUND EQUIPMENT UPDATES

Gina Hirst, City Council Liaison, reported the City Council has asked the consultant for the pickleball courts to remove the stadium style seating and replace the seating with regular benches. It is not the intention of the city to have competitions at the pickleball courts, but to have the courts for the community. There will be shade structures provided. Bruce Cox, Parks and Recreation Director, told Adam Alba he met with the design engineers last week, and they are adding the finishing touches on the electrical work. The bid for this project will be sent out next week.

Sean Hall said he asked his nine- and eleven-year-old sons what they would like to see in a park design, and they said the park should have a zip line. The Committee discussed having adult fitness equipment at the park. Matt Layton said he attends youth football games at the Community Park in the fall, and he is concerned about children from other neighborhoods destroying the playground equipment. Gina Hirst said her children visit a park in Arizona where there is a rope climbing area, and the sun in Arizona is what is damaging to the equipment. It needs to be determined if there is a warranty or maintenance agreement on the playground equipment.

Gina Hirst, City Council Liaison, said the Parks Master Plan needs to be updated and adopted into the Centerville Master Plan. She will provide the Parks Committee with a copy of the Parks Master Plan.

Adam Alba will send an email, with a copy to Bruce Cox, of the items the Committee would like to have at the Community Park, which are:

- Zip-line (glide along feature)
- Adult fitness equipment
- Make certain the pickleball courts and nets are sized properly and that they face north/south.

MOVIES IN THE PARK DISCUSSION

The Committee discussed that volunteers are needed to help set-up and take down equipment on the night of the movies. At least two Committee members are needed the evening of the movies. The Committee also discussed what to do with the electrical cords that are on the ground, as they are a safety hazard for people who might trip on them.

Sean Hall said the projector bulbs are very expensive (\$400 each), and if the bulb goes out, the projector will shut down. The Committee discussed purchasing a spare bulb to keep on hand, or purchasing a new projector since the cost of new projectors has gone down. Gina Hirst, City Council Liaison, said she will discuss this item with the City Council at their budget retreat.

Adam Alba will email a volunteer sign-up sheet for Committee members to serve at the Movies in the Park.

NEIGHBORHOOD NIGHTS DISCUSSION

Gina Hirst, City Council Liaison, said she attended one of the Neighborhood Nights last year, and it was well attended.

There were police officers who attended and visited with the citizens, and people played games. Most of the people who came wanted to know more about the city and visit with staff. This is a good activity for the police officers to meet with young people in a friendly atmosphere.
