APPOINTMENT OF LT. ALLEN ACKERSON AS CHIEF OF POLICE AND OATH OF OFFICE

Mayor Wilkinson recognized Lt. Allen Ackerson for his qualification and selection as the new Centerville City Chief of Police.

Councilmember Hirst **moved** to approve Resolution No. 2024-18 appointing Allen Ackerson as the Chief of Police for Centerville City. Councilmember Mecham seconded the motion, which passed by unanimous vote (5-0).

Judge David Miller administered the Oath of Office. Chief Ackerson expressed his gratitude to his family, police department colleagues, and the City Council for supporting and appointing him.
