CENTERVILLE CITY BRANDING DISCUSSION

Representatives from Jibe Media recapped previous sessions and presented two refined logo concepts along with new departmental iterations and color explorations. The Council expressed their views and preferences on the logos. The Council ultimately decided to go with Concept 1A, and gave direction to Jibe to proceed with building the style guide using that logo.

DISCUSSION – DOG PARKS

Parks and Recreation Director Bruce Cox presented an overview of the current regulations allowing dogs in all Centerville parks, the issues faced with dog waste, and the provisions for off-leash areas in specific zones. Brock Hill, the Parks and Recreation Director from Bountiful City, shared insights from Bountiful's experience with their dog park.

It was mentioned that Bountiful's dog park was about 0.9 acres but faced challenges with turf maintenance, substantial maintenance costs, and neighbor complaints. Mr. Hill explained that the implementation of dog parks required significant commitment and regular rule enforcement primarily via social pressures among park users.

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1 The council discussed several concerns, including size requirements, maintenance,
2 budget implications, and the impact on surrounding neighborhoods. It was highlighted that
3 enforcement of dog park rules is essential and that dedicated year-round staff might be
4 necessary.
