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21 **MINUTES REVIEW AND APPROVAL**

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23 Minutes of the March 12, 2024 meeting were reviewed. Sean Hall made a **motion** to
24 approve the minutes as written. Adam Alba seconded the motion, which was passed by unanimous
25 vote (4-0).

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27 **PLAYGROUND EQUIPMENT DISCUSSION**

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29 Bruce Cox, Parks and Recreation Manager, displayed four catalogs from playground
30 equipment companies. Sonntag Playground Equipment was the company used for the Island View
31 Park. Garrett Recreation has the footprint of the playground area for the Community Park, and
32 they would like to give a bid on the design they are purposing. The playground equipment and
33 pickleball courts cannot be built until the National Parks Service Grant is received. The grant was
34 to have been awarded last September, but it has not been awarded at this time. The grant is for
35 \$150,000, and the city will provide \$150,000 for a total of \$300,000.

37 If the cost to install the playground equipment is over \$25,000, then it must be sent out to
38 bid, and the city will be the general contractor. Play World has also installed three other
39 playgrounds with Garrett Recreation, and they have been asked to submit a bid. Swings are
40 popular at parks, as schools have removed swings because of liability issues. Most parks are geared
41 towards five-to twelve-year-old children.

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43 **At 7:25 p.m., Bryce King, Community Services Manager, arrived at the meeting.**

Sean Hall reported at the last meeting he asked his boys what playground equipment they would like at a park, and they both said a zipline. At least half of the playground area needs to be wheelchair accessible. Bruce Cox reported a donation in the amount of \$1,000 was received from Silver Eagle Oil Refinery for a toddlers swing set. Bryce King, Community Services Manager, suggested Committee members talk to their constituents on what amenities they would like to see at the Community Park. A survey could also be conducted on the city's Facebook page. Mr. King suggested Committee members visit the Gray Hawk Park in Layton to see the amenities at this park. Committee members were asked to make a list of amenities they would like to have at the park and bring them to the next meeting.

MOVIES IN THE PARK

Sean Hall will send a volunteer list for Committee members to sign-up to help at the Movies in the Park this summer. Bryce King, Community Services Manager, is continuing to research a new movie projector. Haley Turner is doing the Neighborhood Nights activity in July. This activity takes place at a park, and the citizens are allowed to ask city employees questions. She will be sending a sign-up list for Committee members to help with this activity.

PICKLEBALL COURTS

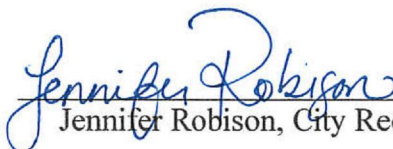
Bruce Cox, Parks and Recreation Director, reported there will be no shade structure, restrooms, or drinking fountain for the pickleball courts at this time. These amenities can be added at a later date. As soon as the grant is received, construction on the courts will begin. It is possible that 80 parking stalls will be added in the future.

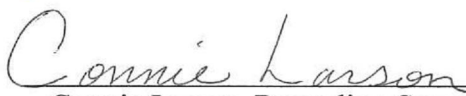
The next Parks and Recreation Committee meeting will be held on Tuesday, May 14th, 2024 at 7:00 p.m. at City Hall.
