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21 **MINUTES REVIEW AND APPROVAL**

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23 Sean Hall made a **motion** to approve the October 10, 2024 meeting minutes as amended.
24 Adam Alba seconded the motion, which was passed by unanimous vote (4-0).

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26 **COMMUNITY PARK PLAYGROUND**

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28 Haley Turner, Community Services Manager, reported she needs feedback from the Trails
29 Committee on the playground equipment designs they would like for the Community Park so that
30 it can be presented to the City Council on December 3rd. She would like the information by
31 November 15th. The Trails Committee discussed park themes they prefer and viewed the Park and
32 Play design from Garrett Parks and Play. The Trails Committee discussed features they like such
33 as multiple levels, climbing features, swings, and a ninja course. Shade coverings are expensive
34 and would only be on the main feature. Two more bids must be obtained, and Sonntag Recreation
35 LLC and Landscape Structures and Playground Equipment will be asked to submit bids.

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37 Bryce King, Administrative Services Director, reported there have been problems at the
38 Island View Park with the playground next to the volleyball court, as children have been taking
39 sand out of the volleyball court and putting it on the turf of the playground. The sand of the
40 volleyball court has been replaced with lawn. Haley Turner will ask Garrett Parks and Play for
41 suggestions on playground surfaces that the Committee can consider.

COMMUNITY PARK PICKLEBALL COURTS UPDATE

Bryce King reported construction of the pickleball courts has begun, and site work construction depends on the weather. Surfacing will not be completed until spring. Gina Hirst, City Council Liaison, said the parking lot will be revised, and 60 more parking spaces will be added. The I-15 freeway expansion will take some of the parking, and the sidewalk will be readjusted. Bryce King said there is concern for the pickleball courts, as there is no power pipe to the courts, except for the lights. There needs to be a power pipe for tournaments, and power needs to be brought from the pump station. This is a \$40,000 to \$50,000 project. There will be an air court sensor that will be installed to give feedback to people to let them know if courts are available without people having to go to the courts and wait for an opening. This feature will also gather data on when the courts are being used.

There is a need for donations for paddle holders, benches, and a practice board at the courts. Suggestions are to ask the welding department at Viewmont to make metal benches, and a QR Code could be set up for donations towards amenities at the courts. Gina Hirst, City Council Liaison, said John Hollingshead is president of the Centerville Community Foundation that helps to fund projects in Centerville. Aaron Getz said he will contact Mr. Hollingshead about possibly helping with these projects.

Bryce King said banners will be placed at Island View Park in the spring of items at the park that need donations. He will also advertise on social media and through campaigning.

PROPOSED PARKS MASTER PLAN

Adam Alba explained the purpose of generating a Parks Master Plan is for the Parks and Recreation Committee to give the City Council and the community a vision and plan for the parks in Centerville. The last time the Parks Master Plan was completed was in 2019 by a college student, but the plan was never adopted and it has missing components. Mr. Alba asked if it would be possible to contract a professional to complete the Parks Master Plan. Bryce King said he has connections that he will contact to see if they could possibly do the Master Plan for the Parks, as well as the Trails Master Plan. There is an overlap of these two Committees and they need to work together on the Master Plan.

At 7:50 p.m., Sean Hall was excused from the meeting.

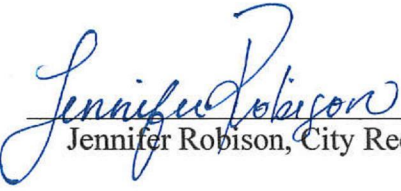

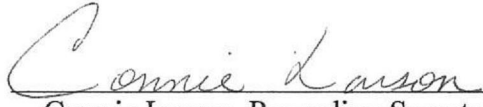
The next Parks and Recreation Committee meeting will be held on Tuesday, December 10, 2024 at 7:00 p.m. at City Hall.
