23 **EMERGENCY OPERATIONS PLAN AMENDMENTS – INFECTIOUS DISEASE PLAN**
24 **AMENDMENTS – LEVEL FIVE INCIDENTS**

26 Chief Child explained recommended changes to the City's Infectious Disease Plan,
27 including the addition of risk Level Five (shelter-in-place order), and received feedback from the
28 Council. The Council and Staff discussed drafting a reduction in force policy. Mayor Wilkinson
29 stated that as of March 31, 2020, the City remained at incident Level Four. He said he had chosen
30 not to declare a local state of emergency at that time.

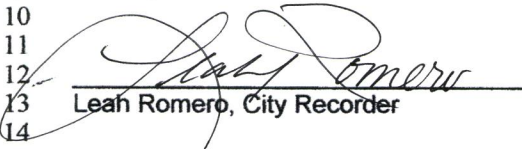
32 Councilmember McEwan **moved** to adopt Resolution No. 2020-09 amending the
33 Infectious Disease Response Plan as part of the Emergency Operations Plan to add new Level
34 Five incident response protocols, add a definition of "infectious disease", change all references to
35 "City" to be uppercase, and add language to Police Protocols recommended by Chief Child.
36 Councilmember Ivie seconded the motion, which passed by unanimous vote (5-0). The Council
37 discussed marking playgrounds at City parks as closed.
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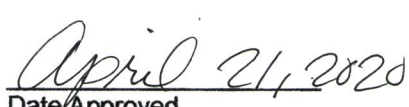
39 **STATUS OF COMMUNITY EVENTS AND CITY MEETINGS**
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41 Leah Romero, City Recorder, reported that most community events and City meetings
42 had been cancelled through May 31, 2020. Mr. Hanson added that City Hall would be unavailable
43 as a meeting place through the end of May. The Council and Staff discussed possible changes
44 to community events beyond May, including the baseball program, summer recreation program,
45 movies in the park, and the 4th of July celebration. Mr. Hanson discouraged moving forward with
46 spring green-waste collection at City parks to avoid creating gathering places where COVID-19
47 might spread. Responding to a question from Councilmember Mecham, Mr. Hanson said the
48 green-waste collection could occur later in the year.

ADJOURNMENT AND RDA MEETING

At 5:35 p.m., Councilmember Ince moved to adjourn the regular Council meeting and move to a meeting of the Redevelopment Agency of Centerville, with no intention to return to open meeting. Councilmember Mecham seconded the motion, which passed by unanimous vote (5-0).
