26 **UTAH TRANSIT AUTHORITY (UTA) BUS ROUTE UPDATE**

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28 Beth Holbrook and Hal Johnson with UTA provided an update on existing bus routes
29 serving Centerville, as well as public feedback and plans for the Davis-Salt Lake Community
30 Connector project. Councilmembers expressed concern with proposed reduction in the number
31 of bus stops offered in Centerville. Mr. Johnson said he envisioned the UTA On-Demand
32 program filling in some of the gaps for community members. Ms. Holbrook spoke of the
33 continued need for public transportation through the current pandemic.

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35 Councilmember Ivie expressed the opinion that Bus Rapid Transit was not wanted in
36 Centerville at this time, and suggested the west side of the City as more appropriate for public
37 transportation than Main Street. Councilmember Fillmore emphasized the need to broaden
38 public input. Councilmembers McEwan and Ivie said they would not be willing to invest the
39 suggested \$12,000 into broadening public input. Councilmember Mecham pointed out that
40 ridership after the pandemic was unknown. Councilmember Fillmore expressed the opinion that
41 including Centerville in the connectivity plan was important for the future. Mayor Wilkinson
42 emphasized that transportation issues needed to be addressed, and stated it would be a
43 disservice to community members if public transportation options were not provided. Ms.
44 Holbrook commented that expansion and growth in all areas of Davis County and Salt Lake City
45 would impact transportation needs of everyone along the corridor.

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47 **WEBER BASIN WATER CONSERVANCY DISTRICT WATER CONSERVATION**
48 **DISCUSSION**

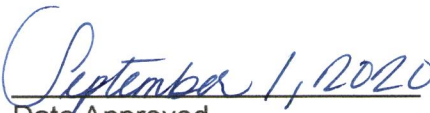
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50 Tage Flint and Jon Parry with Weber Basin Water Conservancy District updated the
51 Council on the Weber Basin service area, particularly secondary water service to the north

1 portion of Centerville City. Mr. Parry spoke of secondary water conservation efforts, including:
2 public education, codes and standards, water waste restrictions, water distribution system
3 improvements, metering water use, irrigation efficiency improvements, and landscape
4 ordinances. He suggested that benefits to Centerville City of improved secondary water use
5 would include efficient system operations, lower costs, and sustainable landscapes. Mr. Parry
6 thanked City Staff for their support of Weber Basin's plan to install irrigation water meters in the
7 north portion of Centerville beginning this fall. Mr. Flint explained that a proposed ordinance
8 would be presented to the Council in the near future.
