32 **WINDSTORM DISASTER 2020 UPDATE**

34 The Mayor, Council, and Staff discussed windstorm damage and cleanup with Davis
35 County Commissioners. Councilmember Ince suggested putting information together to provide
36 direction for residents needing to remove large tree stumps. Randy Randall, Public Works
37 Director, emphasized the need for the City to complete clean-up efforts before winter weather
38 started. Paul Child, Centerville Police Chief, reported that the City would discontinue accepting
39 green waste at Community Park at the end of the day (September 15th). Brant Hanson, City
40 Manager, commended City Staff and Centerville citizens for outstanding cooperation and service
41 following the windstorm. Parks and Recreation Director Bruce Cox encouraged citizens to be
42 cautious around stumps and broken branches that had not yet been removed. Councilmember
43 Ivie asked about the likelihood of Rocky Mountain Power burying power lines, and Mr. Hanson
44 responded that the City would most likely have to bear the cost since burying existing lines would
45 not be considered cost-effective for Rocky Mountain.

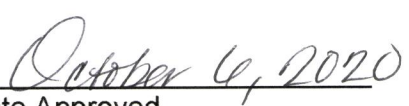
ISLAND VIEW PARK UPDATE

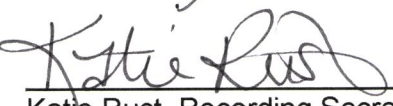
Bruce Cox updated the Council on finishing touches at the newly renovated Island View Park. He said he had received a lot of positive community feedback regarding the renewed park. Councilmember Ivie said she had noticed a sprinkler that needed to be adjusted. Mr. Cox confirmed that the Parks and Recreation Department would check and adjust the irrigation system. The Council and Staff discussed multi-use of the paved trails at the park. Councilmember Fillmore suggested a catch net on the west side of the volleyball court to prevent balls from rolling down the hillside. Mike Wonenberg with G. Brown Design said a shade study would soon be completed.

At 6:50 p.m., Councilmember Ince **moved** to adjourn the work session. Councilmember Ivie seconded the motion, which passed by unanimous vote (5-0).
