DETERMINATION

PARKS AND RECREATION DISCUSSION

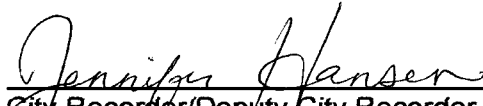
Lynn Keddington, member of the Parks and Recreation Committee, explained the idea of financially partnering with South Davis Recreation District to provide pickle ball courts at Community Park. He suggested the Centerville Community Foundation could raise a portion of the money, and the City could apply for a grant to help reach the estimated \$600,000 needed. He proposed the following break-down: \$250,000 from the South Davis Recreation District, \$250,000 from Centerville City, and \$100,000 from the Centerville Community Foundation. In exchange for Recreation District funding, the Recreation District could be granted priority scheduling of the pickle ball courts for leagues for a specific length of time. Mr. Keddington commented that both entities would benefit from partnering financially. If a grant were received, grant funds could be split between the two entities, used for additional amenities at Community Park, or given entirely to the Recreation District.

As the City representative on the South Davis Recreation Board, Councilmember Fillmore said she appreciated the creativity in trying to reduce the cost of the project for the City. She expressed concern that citizens would expect pickle ball courts at the City park to be available for citizen use, and spoke of potential complications in partnering with the Recreation District. She commented that the Recreation District was created to provide recreation facilities that were too expensive for individual cities to provide on their own. Councilmember Fillmore said she did not know if it had ever been a goal of the Recreation District to build pickle ball courts. A majority of the Council indicated they were in favor of exploring the possibility further.

1 Mr. Cox informed the Council that the cost of wetland credits would increase at the start
2 of 2021, and suggested the Council consider mitigating remaining wetland at Community Park
3 while possible. Councilmember Fillmore suggested adding a discussion to the next Council
4 meeting agenda. Mayor Wilkinson expressed agreement.

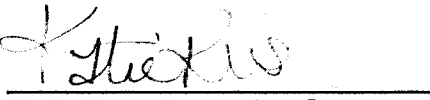
