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35 **MUNICIPAL CODE AMENDMENTS – CITY PARKS – CMC 8.02.022**

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37 On February 16, 2021, the City Council approved Resolution No. 2021-11 renaming the
38 Lee Skabelund Memorial Nature Park. City Attorney Lisa Romney recommended similar
39 amendments to Section 8.02.022 of the Centerville Municipal Code regarding names of City
40 Parks. Ordinance No. 2021-06 was prepared for that purpose.

42 Councilmember Mecham **moved** to approve Ordinance No. 2021-06 regarding
43 amendments to CMC 8.02.022 renaming the Lee Skabelund Memorial Nature Park.
44 Councilmember Ivie seconded the motion, which passed by unanimous vote (5-0).

49 Ms. Romney explained the applicant was required to provide public utility easements on
50 three sides of the subject parcel at 124 East 400 South as a condition of building permit
51 application. She recommended the Council accept the public utility easement and direct the City
52 Recorder to submit the same for recording at the Davis County Recorder's Office.

Councilmember Ince **moved** to approve the public utility easement as outlined. Councilmember Mecham seconded the motion, which passed by unanimous vote (5-0).

CONFLICTS OF INTEREST AND ETHICS TRAINING

City Attorney Lisa Romney provided training regarding conflicts of interest and ethics, including the Utah Municipal Officers' and Employees' Ethics Act as set forth in Utah Code §10-3-1301, and answered questions from the Council.

- Mayor Wilkinson asked the Council for feedback regarding July 4th celebrations in 2021.

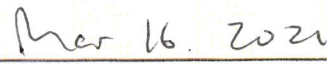
CITY MANAGER'S REPORT
