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21 **MINUTES REVIEW AND APPROVAL**

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23 Minutes of the April 28, 2015 Parks and Recreation Committee meeting minutes were
24 reviewed. Kyle Barney made a **motion** to approve the minutes as written. Rebecca Wright
25 seconded the motion, which was passed by unanimous vote (4-0).

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27 **PARKS CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PLAN DRAFT REVIEW**

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29 Chair Gary Goff reported the Parks Capital Improvement Plan Draft was given to Steve
30 Thacker, City Manager, for his review. The draft was reviewed by the Committee, and it was
31 agreed the top 18 items on the list are the ones that need to be focused on at this time. The most
32 controversial item is the splash pad, as it is a high maintenance item, and costly. The Committee
33 discussed the demographic population information of Centerville from the 2000 census. The
34 Committee discussed working with the South Davis Recreation Center to help improve their
35 programs instead of Centerville trying to fund programs on their own. Councilwoman Tamilyn
36 Fillmore suggested moving the replacement of playgrounds to the top of the list, as it could
37 probably be completed in the near future. The stripping of bike lanes will be removed from the
38 list, as this is a Trails Committee item.

40 Rebecca Wright asked about the possibility of pocket parks in Centerville. Bruce Cox,
41 Parks and Recreation Director, explained several years ago the City Council, at that time,
42 determined large parks in each quadrant of the City is a much more economical goal for the cost
43 vs. benefit. Pocket parks are more money to maintain than a large park, and more activities can be
44 done at large parks than in pocket parks.

MOVIE POSTERS TO DISTRIBUTE

Bruce Cox, Parks and Recreation Director, distributed flyers advertising the Movies in the Park for this summer at Founders Park. The movies in the park will cost \$4,300 for this year.

BASKETBALL

Chair Gary Goff reported the basketball tournament does not look feasible, as three of the boys are leaving on missions for the LDS Church.

OTHER

Bruce Cox displayed a map of the Freedom Hills Park which shows the placement of the targets for disc golf. The majority of the funds for the disc golf course came from the Rotary Club. Woods Cross will also be having a disc golf course in the near future.

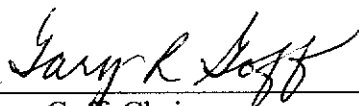
At 8:00 p.m., Rebecca Wright was excused from the meeting.
