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24 **MINUTES REVIEW AND APPROVAL**

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26 Minutes of the May 9, 2017 Parks and Recreation Committee meeting were reviewed.
27 Kelli Hintze made a **motion** to approve the minutes as written. Melissa Larsen seconded the
28 motion, which was passed by unanimous vote (5-0).

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30 **RSL REPRESENTATIVE FOOTBALL PRESENTATION**

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32 Mary VanMinde, Director Community Relations, RSL Foundation, explained that two
33 years ago, REAL Salt Lake started the RSL Foundation to give back to the communities in Utah.
34 This Foundation has three pillars which are:

36 1) Training teenagers from Title One high schools to be soccer referees. United States
37 Soccer Referees are brought to Salt Lake City to help train these young people. Thirty
38 percent of soccer games in Utah County are postponed and rescheduled because of a
39 lack of referees. It costs \$100 for training to be a referee, but the RSL Foundation pays
40 for the fees for these young people from disadvantaged situations who want to be
41 referees.

2) Building healthier gathering places. Footsal is popular in South America and Europe because it teaches children how to play soccer on a smaller court when they are young. Mary distributed pictures of courts at the Northwest Community Center in Salt Lake City, and at the Taylorsville Park that the RSL Foundation constructed. When a court is completed, a grand opening is held and the community is invited to attend.

3) It costs \$70,000 to make a Fotsal court, and the RSL Foundation raises all of the funds. The courts are made of post tension concrete, and then covered with an overlay similar to tennis courts. They are very low maintenance and last a long time. Tamilyn Fillmore, City Council Liaison, explained she is on the South Davis Recreation District Board, and the goal is to keep recreation level soccer alive. Most young people don't want to give a yearlong commitment to a league. The Community Park is adding fields, and the goal is to keep recreation soccer alive. When a Fotsal court site is selected, the RSL Foundation sends out their engineers to survey the site and draw the plans. Once the court is in place, the sponsors are allowed to have their logo on the court, along with the REAL logo. The RSL Foundation holds a soccer clinic each year on the courts, and they maintain the courts. If Centerville chooses to have Fotsal courts, the earliest date would be May of 2018. The Committee reviewed the site plans for the Freedom Hills and Community Parks for possible locations for the courts.

Tiffany Rees made a **motion** to direct Jon Ruedas to work with the RSL Foundation to make site visits and make recommendations for Fotsal courts at the Community Park. Jon Ruedas seconded the motion, which was passed by unanimous vote (5-0).

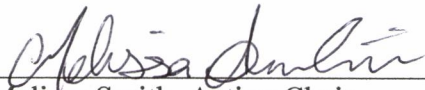
