MINUTES REVIEW AND APPROVAL

Minutes of the April 28, 2015 Parks and Recreation Committee meeting minutes were reviewed. Kyle Barney made a **motion** to approve the minutes as written. Rebecca Wright seconded the motion, which was passed by unanimous vote (4-0).

PARKS CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PLAN DRAFT REVIEW

Chair Gary Goff reported the Parks Capital Improvement Plan Draft was given to Steve Thacker, City Manager, for his review. The draft was reviewed by the Committee, and it was agreed the top 18 items on the list are the ones that need to be focused on at this time. The most controversial item is the splash pad, as it is a high maintenance item, and costly. The Committee discussed the demographic population information of Centerville from the 2000 census. The Committee discussed working with the South Davis Recreation Center to help improve their programs instead of Centerville trying to fund programs on their own. Councilwoman Tamilyn Fillmore suggested moving the replacement of playgrounds to the top of the list, as it could probably be completed in the near future. The stripping of bike lanes will be removed from the list, as this is a Trails Committee item.

Rebecca Wright asked about the possibility of pocket parks in Centerville. Bruce Cox, Parks and Recreation Director, explained several years ago the City Council, at that time, determined large parks in each quadrant of the City is a much more economical goal for the cost vs. benefit. Pocket parks are more money to maintain than a large park, and more activities can be done at large parks than in pocket parks.

At 7:50 p.m., Councilwoman Tamilyn Fillmore was excused from the meeting.

MOVIE POSTERS TO DISTRIBUTE

Bruce Cox, Parks and Recreation Director, distributed flyers advertising the Movies in the Park for this summer at Founders Park. The movies in the park will cost \$4,300 for this year.

VOLLEYBALL

Rebecca Wright reported she talked with the man at Club V to finalize a date for the volleyball tournaments. She is also working on the payment fees with Club V.

SOCCER EVENT UPDATE

Lynn Keddington reported nobody has signed up for the soccer tournament. Announcements and flyers will be given at Viewmont High School, Centerville Junior High, and the elementary schools. The deadline for the sign-up is June 10th.

BASKETBALL

Chair Gary Goff reported the basketball tournament does not look feasible, as three of the boys are leaving on missions for the LDS Church.

OTHER

Bruce Cox displayed a map of the Freedom Hills Park which shows the placement of the targets for disc golf. The majority of the funds for the disc golf course came from the Rotary Club. Woods Cross will also be having a disc golf course in the near future.

At 8:00 p.m., Rebecca Wright was excused from the meeting.
