MINUTES REVIEW AND APPROVAL

Minutes of the May 9, 2017 Parks and Recreation Committee meeting were reviewed. Kelli Hintze made a **motion** to approve the minutes as written. Melissa Larsen seconded the motion, which was passed by unanimous vote (5-0).

RSL REPRESENTATIVE FOOTBALL PRESENTATION

Mary VanMinde, Director Community Relations, RSL Foundation, explained that two years ago, REAL Salt Lake started the RSL Foundation to give back to the communities in Utah. This Foundation has three pillars which are:

- 1) Training teenagers from Title One high schools to be soccer referees. United States Soccer Referees are brought to Salt Lake City to help train these young people. Thirty percent of soccer games in Utah County are postponed and rescheduled because of a lack of referees. It costs \$100 for training to be a referee, but the RSL Foundation pays for the fees for these young people from disadvantaged situations who want to be referees.

- 1 2) Building healthier gathering places. Footsal is popular in South America and Europe
2 because it teaches children how to play soccer on a smaller court when they are young.
3 Mary distributed pictures of courts at the Northwest Community Center in Salt Lake
4 City, and at the Taylorsville Park that the RSL Foundation constructed. When a court
5 is completed, a grand opening is held and the community is invited to attend.

7 3) It costs \$70,000 to make a Footsal court, and the RSL Foundation raises all of the funds.
8 The courts are made of post tension concrete, and then covered with an overlay similar
9 to tennis courts. They are very low maintenance and last a long time. Tamilyn Fillmore,
10 City Council Liaison, explained she is on the South Davis Recreation District Board,
11 and the goal is to keep recreation level soccer alive. Most young people don't want to
12 give a yearlong commitment to a league. The Community Park is adding fields, and the
13 goal is to keep recreation soccer alive. When a Footsal court site is selected, the RSL
14 Foundation sends out their engineers to survey the site and draw the plans. Once the
15 court is in place, the sponsors are allowed to have their logo on the court, along with
16 the REAL logo. The RSL Foundation holds a soccer clinic each year on the courts, and
17 they maintain the courts. If Centerville chooses to have Footsal courts, the earliest date
18 would be May of 2018. The Committee reviewed the site plans for the Freedom Hills
19 and Community Parks for possible locations for the courts.

21 Tiffany Rees made a **motion** to direct Jon Ruedas to work with the RSL Foundation to
22 make site visits and make recommendations for Footsal courts at the Community Park. Jon Ruedas
23 seconded the motion, which was passed by unanimous vote (5-0).
