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22 **MINUTES REVIEW AND APPROVAL**

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24 Minutes of the August 26, 2014 Parks and Recreation Committee meeting were reviewed.
25 Kyle Barney made a **motion** to approve the minutes as written. Melissa Smith seconded the
26 motion, which was passed by unanimous vote (4-0).

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28 **RECREATION PROGRAM SUMMARY**

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30 Chair Goff explained the purpose of the Parks and Recreation Committee, and it was
31 suggested at the last meeting how the Committee can be more involved in the recreation aspect of
32 the City activities. Lisa Summers, Recreation Coordinator, distributed the Centerville City
33 Community Information and Events Guide for 2014. Lisa has been doing Centerville's Recreation
34 Program for the past 23 years. The opportunity for recreation has grown during the past several
35 years, and other cities also offer recreation programs that Centerville residents use. The current
36 trend is that the demand for more adult recreation classes in the community is tapering off, because
37 of family activities, civic responsibilities, and religious activities. This fall, hunter safety classes
38 and merit badge classes will be offered. In years past there were several different class options
39 including cooking classes, ballroom dance classes, The Biggest Loser weight loss program,
40 scrapbooking and gardening classes but many claim not to have time for adult classes. Centerville
41 recreation does not want to compete with the South Davis Recreation Center activities and
42 programs but would like to use the Center's available rooms for possible classes but has been
43 turned down in the past and told that is not a possibility.

1 The Committee discussed if it is feasible to try and share recreation programs with the
2 surrounding communities. Currently, Lisa Summers meets on a yearly basis with a State
3 Recreation Committee to share recreation ideas with other communities. Centerville's Recreation
4 Program is run independently, and there are no plans to coordinate activities with other
5 communities.

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7 Winter is the best time to offer adult classes since the youth soccer, football, and baseball
8 programs in off season. Lisa is open to suggestions for adult classes, and of names of qualified
9 adults who could teach classes.

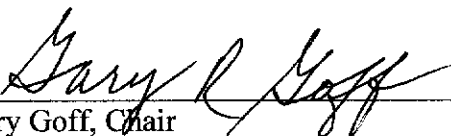
