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22 **CENTENNIAL CELEBRATION DISCUSSION**

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24 Chair Gary Goff reported the Centennial Celebration Committee is requesting a response
25 by December 12th, on what each committee is planning to do as part of the Centennial Celebration
26 scheduled from May 17th to July 4th, 2015. Centerville was settled in 1847, but was not
27 incorporated until 1915. Melissa Smith reported she has been asked to chair the activity portion
28 of the celebration for the City. She will be meeting with all of the committees to have them
29 involved, and to make sure there is no duplication of activities. Melissa would like to have the
30 activities focused on historic events and people.

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32 Chair Goff suggested people could earn an award by going to each park in Centerville and
33 identify how the park got its name, and report on the history of the park. A history of each park
34 could be posted in the kiosk that is already at each park. At the 4th of July celebration, there could
35 be a cannon shoot off, gunny sack races, and a watermelon eating contest. The activities should
36 focus on similar activities that were held at celebrations in 1915. The Committee discussed having
37 tennis, pickle ball, volleyball, and basketball tournaments during the summer as part of the
38 celebration. The Trails Committee is planning to give pins to people who walk and hike all of the
39 trails in Centerville.

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41 Jens Fillmore, Youth Council Liaison, said there would be more participation among
42 teenagers if there were coed sports competitions, such as soccer and volleyball, rather than the
43 earning of pins for completing activities. The tournaments could be held at different parks
44 throughout Centerville. The earning of pins would be better suited for younger children. Melissa
45 will verify if the tournaments could be used as a fundraiser.

COMMUNITY PARK EXPANSION UPDATE

Bruce Cox, Parks and Recreation Director, reported the storm drains at the Community Park have been installed, and the grading of the soil should be completed in two weeks. Kapp Construction is doing the first phase of the work, and the RAP Tax will allow for phases two through four to be completed at a future date. The City Council must first approve the RAP Tax to be on the November 2015 ballot for the citizens to vote for approval of the RAP Tax before any further construction at the park can be completed. The RAP Tax is also needed for upgrades at the Island View Park.

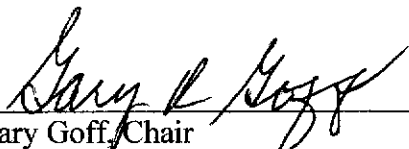

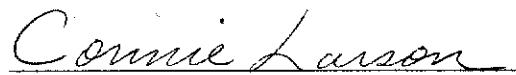
