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19 **OPEN UTAH MEETING ACT**

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21 Chair Dailee Gardner read from the Open Utah Public Meeting Act Section 52.4.207(4)
22 that states the Parks and Recreation Committee is allowed to hold the meeting via Zoom due to
23 the COVID-19 pandemic.

25 **CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT LIST**

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27 The Committee viewed a copy of the Parks Capital Improvement Plan that was approved
28 in February of this year. Lynn Keddington noted none of the items listed have been completed
29 since February when the Committee last met. The Island View park has been completed, and the
30 costs of some items have increased since last February. The addition of the Futsal Courts and the
31 Community Park needs to be added to the Capital Improvement List.

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33 **FUTSAL COURTS**

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35 Jon Ruedas reported he has not heard on the status of the Futsal Courts at the Community
36 Park. He is concerned about the organization changes in the REAL Team management that have
37 occurred recently. It is possible some of their funding sources have changed because of the current
38 economic conditions. The Futsal courts were originally scheduled to have been built this past
39 August. Mr. Ruedas will continue to follow on this item.

41 **PICKLEBALL FUNDING**

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43 Lynn Keddington said he is working on how to obtain funding to build pickleball courts at
44 the Community Park with a minimum amount of funding. He and Dailee Gardner met with the
45 mayor on the possibility of building courts at the Community Park.

1 The mayor is favorable for having pickleball courts, but it would not be until the spring of 2022
2 before funding could be approved for 12 courts at a cost of \$600,000. The Committee discussed
3 approaching the South Davis Recreation District for \$260,000, as a recent survey showed that
4 pickleball courts are a high priority, especially for leagues who play on the courts. Additional
5 funding of \$240,000 would come from the Land and Water Grant, and \$100,000 from private
6 donations.

7
8 Tiffany Rees asked how the land for the courts would be mitigated. Bruce Cox, Parks and
9 Recreation Director, explained the Army Corps of Engineers would need to be involved, and they
10 have been easy to work with in the past on other land issues. They do not like to have little patches
11 of water, as they prefer to see a large function lake for wildlife. It would cost around \$50,000 to
12 mitigate the land.

14 Bruce Cox reported that parking is an issue for the Community Park, and additional parking
15 will be needed if the pickleball courts and pump track are approved.

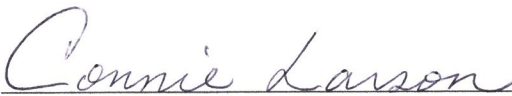
