MINUTES REVIEW AND APPROVAL

Lynn Keddington made a **motion** to approve the February 9, 2021 Planning Commission meeting minutes as amended. Julianne Zollinger seconded the motion, which was passed by unanimous vote (4-0).

MOVIES IN THE PARK

Bruce Cox, Parks and Recreation Director, will program the sprinklers to not turn on at the Smith Park on Friday evenings, and he will ensure that the power will not shut down at 10:00 p.m.

PICKLEBALL COURTS UPDATE

Bruce Cox, Parks and Recreation Director, reported he is trying to work with the Army Corps of Engineers on construction of the pickleball courts and the Community Park. He is also working with ESI to do a concept plan that will go with the permit to be submitted to the Army Corps of Engineers, and a consultant is helping with the mitigation. The Army Corps of Engineers must give their approval before construction on the courts can begin. The plan is for eight courts on the west side of the Community Park. At a future date, there is a possibility of more courts in the north east corner of the park. The grant for the pickleball courts cannot be applied for until the Army Corps of Engineers gives their approval for construction.

PADDLE RACK AT ISLAND VIEW PARK

The Committee discussed the need for a paddle rack for the pickleball courts at Island View Park. The paddle rack allows players to reserve a court by placing their paddles in the rack.

CHASELAND POND

Bruce Cox, Parks and Recreation Director, discussed the road construction project on Chase Lane. This project is to replace storm drain lines and repave the road. Chase Lane and 400 West are not lined-up correctly, and it is difficult to see cars coming from the south. The turn lane will be changed so that the turn lane is more to the center of the road.

Parrish Creek empties into a pond near McDonalds. Years ago, a developer purchased the property in this area, but he could not pay the taxes and defaulted back to the bank. The bank asked the city to take the land back, and the pond became a swamp. The wind storm last September caused damage to large trees in this area. The city received a \$65,000 grant to shrink down the swamp area and clean debris and trees in this area. The Army Corps of Engineers contacted the city to see if they plan to replant trees in this area, and residents in the area want the trees replaced for privacy. Mr. Cox reported the city will plant trees in the pond area, and there are plans to have a walking path with bridges around the pond.

Ivory Homes is constructing 60 homes west of I-15 at Lund Lane near the Garlic Farm. This development will hopefully bring in more Impact Fees, as Impact Fees are too low and need to be increased. Playground renovations at the Community Park is next on the Master Plan. The Parks and Recreation Committee will write a letter to the City Council on the top five priorities for the parks in Centerville.

Chair Dailee Gardner will draft a letter to the City Council that will be signed by Committee members on the top five priorities for the parks in Centerville.
